Course fees

Fees are set prior to each course and are detailed in the individual course brochures. In general, they are approximately as follows (Australia or New Zealand dollars—add GST where applicable):

- One-day course \$350 – \$450
- Two-day course \$850 – \$1,200
- Four and Five-day courses \$2,500 – \$3,500

Appita Courses endorsed in Australia and New Zealand!

Most Appita Short Courses are endorsed by recognized training organizations. In Australia Riverina Insititute endorses courses as TAFE PLUS. Course participants receive a TAFE PLUS Certificate, outlining components of the course which can be assessed at the workplace for credit towards National Competency Standards. In New Zealand, FITEC, the industry training organization, endorses courses where the knowledge gained may earn credits towards the National Certificate. In both countries we are working towards integration of some courses into the national curriculum

• Biomass processing

Australia and/or New Zealand

Wood is nowadays being promoted for more products than pulp and building materials, particularly for fuels. We hear a lot about value-added products from wood, but just how is wood processed? This seminar will examine the processes involved in preparing wood for alternative uses to pulp—it will focus on whole-tree processing and pelletising.

• Mechanical pulping

Australia and New Zealand

Conducted by an internationally-renowned North American specialist in conjunction with local presenters, this course will examine the unit processes in mechanical pulping, from chip preparation, screening, washing, refining, screening and cleaning and rejects refining, and important pulp parameters for quality paper products

• Kraft pulping and chemical recovery

Australia

A two-day course for operators. It will focus on the unit processes in kraft pulping and recovery — wood processing, digestion, washing, bleaching and the chemical recovery cycle. Subject to demand it will be held at or near a mill.
